Central Kitchen Use

The kitchen at Central is used by several groups.

In addition to our coffee time each Sunday, The Shelter uses it every other Sunday, and HiHi on nine Mondays from December through March. And our WCC ladies has occasional weekday use.

As a result, it is everyone's job to return items to the correct place and use the supplies wisely.

Paper good, storage bags, etc., are not cheap, so please use them only when necessary. We have a large bag of donated plastic boxes for take-home or refrigerator storage.

Please take home any leftovers not readily usable – three cookies in a one gallon ziplock bag doesn't make sense! Helping Hand Rescue Mission gets our extra food.

Please do not open a new box of plastic bags, aluminum foil or napkins when there are already two identical ones already open.

Please do not leave dishes to drain; towel them dry and put them away. There are no dish fairies here!!!

Most important, please label your items in the fridge. HiHi uses the left side in their season. Please label yours! Each week the refrigerator will be checked for leftovers. Some scary items have been found. Please label – no excuses.

We do not have recycling pick up in

Huntington Village as we are a commercial zone. Empty plastic and glass bottles are either thrown out or taken home for resident recycling. If you care about our planet, please recycle!!!


Coming this Summer ~
