Happy Thanksgiving, everyone!

What are we thankful for this year? I recently had an opportunity to hold these three baseball cards in my hands (there were others, including a Phil Rizzutto, Warren Spahn—it was...incredible!). They belonged to the father of a friend who had passed, and my friend was in the process of selling them to settle the estate.

For those of you with eagle eyes, the one on top is, indeed, a Joe DiMaggio rookie card (a grade 4 version recently sold for 5 million dollars). Or, as my friend said to me, "Please pray that when we officially put this one on the market, it will be

graded 4..." (lol, it is not a 4). Looks pretty good next to Satchel and the Babe, huh?

The family is selling to take care of various needs, both of this and the next generation. And it is understandable. But just as we were putting these cards away, my friend then posed an even more intriguing question. "Now that you've seen these, wanna see the most treasured cards in our collection?"

How could I say no?

He then opened up a separate folder. These were black and white cards. And in their pristine condition, they would have also sold for much money. But, my friend explained, when his father was a young boy who collected them, he had painstakingly hand-painted them with watercolor. When the card expert saw them, he apparently had remarked, "If only they had not been painted…the would have been worth thousands, each."

But this is when my friend looked into my eyes, and said, "You see, Paul, our family is happy to sell the cards you first saw because to the world, they have a monetary value. But to our family, the real treasures are these b/w cards that my dad had painted by his own hands. To us, they are...priceless."

As I was driving home that day, the realization dawned on me—how those cards taught me a simple lesson about what true Thanksgiving is all about!

Our dominant culture far too often assess value based on what can be sold and bought while here on earth. Hence, my friend's quite serious request for prayers that when the Di Maggio card is about to be sold, that it is graded as 4.

But in the kingdom to which we belong and strive to reach, what we most value are the lives that have been touched—even painted—by the hand of God. For us, the true value lies in how God molds us—maybe even breaks us—and leaves his divine fingerprints on us. For the world, unable to fully grasp the beauty of God, the Church may seem hopelessly out of fashion. But that is because the colors and the lines God draws on us are not for the hopelessly myopic eyes of our human perception. No, God marks us for eternity through Jesus, way beyond the forced perspective of human eyes and hearts. God is making us His masterpieces. In Jesus Christ, we are truly a new creation!

What will you give thanks for this year?

As we said around the table and look into the faces of those around us, let us look for, and learn to value, the marks of our wonderful Lord.

By the way, my current recommendation would be for us to rent the AMC on Wall Street for our immediate worship, with the goal of becoming a multi-site church focusing on young families. Among many examples, the "Theater Church" down in Washington, DC, is a good example—but others abound.

But here's the rub. No matter what, come every Sunday, somewhere near or about the coordinates 40.871336, -73.425294, Central Church WILL be praising God in the heart of Huntington. Because God has a mission for us to carry out. Our job is to praise Jesus, and to invite our friends and neighbors to hear the Good News: Jesus has Risen!
